Academy of Maritime of Education And Training, NSS CELL Organized Coastal cleanup program at Marina beach organized by the Faculty coordinators Mr. Neela Prasad U.N.(NSS COORDINATOR) and MrV.Siva Kumar along with Marine Engineering Department .In this event 30 volunteers participated,Program started at 6.30 am with a speech delivered by our Chief Guest C/E Mr. Shathish Kumar the speech was about creating awareness on cancer causes and symptoms of cancer and how to take care of body heath condition.

The event started at 7.00 am, the volunteers are divided into groups to cover the areas of the beach.

The volunteers collected the plastic materials for a period of one and half hours and then the volunteers were gathered and kept the plastics waste in area and plastic wastes weighed around 8kg of plastics and 5 kg of glass bottles. Then the event ended by taking photographs.

Beach cleanups are volunteer activities that take place on a regular basis along coastlines around the world. Environmental groups, civic organizations and individual beachgoers collect beach trash to make the beach a nicer, safer place and also to improve the coastal and ocean ecosystem. Beach Cleanup

AMET University Marine department have been organizing and conducting beach cleanups on a regular basis for over few years. The cleanups have two goals - 1) a clean beach and 2) changing human behavior and creating a "beach ethic" so that beach cleanups eventually become unnecessary. Materials collected at these cleanups range from a distressing number of cigarette butts and small pieces of plastic to plastic bottles and bags to fishing nets. We attempt to separate recyclable material

from trash and we also encourage participants to bring their own bags, buckets and gloves to make the events as "green" as possible.

Beach cleaning or clean-up is the process of removing solid litter, dense chemicals, and organic debris deposited on a beach or coastline by the tide, local visitors, or tourists. Humans pollute beaches with materials such as plastic bottles and bags, plastic straws, fishing gear, cigarette filters, Six pack rings, Surgical mask and many other items that often lead to environmental degradation. Every year hundreds of thousands of volunteers comb beaches and coastlines around the world to clean this debris. These materials are also called "marine debris" or "marine pollution" and their quantity has been increasing due to anthropocentric activities.

There are some major sources of beach debris such as beach users, oceans, sea drifts, and river flow. Many beach users leave their litter behind on the beaches after activities. Also, marine debris or chemicals such as raw oil drift from oceans or seas and accumulate on beaches. Additionally, many rivers bring some cities' trashes to beaches. These pollutants harm marine life and ecology, human health, and coastal tourism. Hartley study shows that environmental education is important to eliminate many beach pollutants on beaches and the marine environment













Outcome: At the end of the program, the marine cadets were more aware of future in beach cleaning and Awareness of cancer due to plastics.
